5. Don and Karen Peris as brother and sister, instead of husband and wife.



The new album, "Glow" will be released abroad on February 20th, and here in the United States on April 4th. The recording process began in New Orleans, made its way to Houston, and then ended with the mix down in Seattle. Replacing Larry Klein as producer is Dennis Herring, who in the past has teamed up with Camper Van Beethoven.

Also new is the fact that the Innocence Mission is releasing their *first* commercial cd single called, "Bright As Yellow." This will be released on February 14th, and will also be sold at their concerts (no dates have yet been set, but could start as early as February or March). The single, con't...


