





On June 6th, 1995, A&M finally released The Innocence Mission's 3rd CD, "Glow." The new CD had been put on hold for several months until A&M was sure they could properly promote the album. No videos have been planned as of yet, but the GLOW TOUR has already begun (see page 7 for more details).

The band just finished their pre-release tour at Lancaster's Chameleon Club following a rocky start in Philadelphia at the Tin Angel. After a long layoff from the Umbrella tour, nerves certainly played a part at the Tin Angel, but when they returned in June, they were back to old form with an even more impressive show of confidence and eagerness to play.

Their tour was filled with new songs from "Glow" as well as a host of songs from their two prior CD's and several covers including Joni Mitchell's "Both Sides Now," Ocean Blue's "Love Song," and a surf instrumental from The Ventures.

Their debut commercial single, "Bright As Yellow" was released February 14th on schedule. Also found on the CD were non-lp tracks "Let's Talk About Something Else" and "Geranium Lake," which were recorded at home in Lancaster by Don Peris. This CD can be obtained from the band on tour or at their PO Box found in the insert of their past CD's. Also, many record distributors are carrying it as well, so check around.


Bootlegs

Karen was wearing a very pretty purple dress that looked very good on her. She also has perfect teeth. - *Tony Zamora*


My alarm clock radio woke me up by playing Black Sheep Wall. - Dan King

Review: Worth The Weight!

So I finally purchased Glow. The local stores around San Jose, CA have done a great job of stocking singles and albums (yes, I bought both). The whole event was wonderful, as I had long ago resigned myself to believing that IM were history. Thank God for Glow!!

There's been a lot of discussion regarding the influences/resemblances between IM and (insert band here). While comparisons are always unfair, some are definitely worth mentioning. Some have mentioned the Sundays as a "sounds like" band, but I tend to disagree except on "That Was Another Country"- especially the drumming.

On the whole, the album is wonderful. I can't think of a weak track - the whole is consistently creative, punctuated by little surprises. My favorite is the two-key piano strike during the intro to "Happy, the End" - it seals the mood and shows a great command of subtly.

If I can make anything in the way of criticism (and it really isn't), I'd say that on the whole the songs are not as lyrically rich as the "Umbrella" set. No "I thought, Isn't Mother Grand?/ The way she flies and flies /into the sting of the cold /and the prick of the barbed wire." Such rich lines made Umbrella but appear as embellishments in Glow as in "There": "And all the clouds are weary whales swimming by to find you". However, an IM lyric is always a special, precious thing, and Glow is filled with great observations that most people and nearly all songwriters forget.

All in all, worth the weight. Just please don't let us wait so long again. Be back soon, we'll be thinking about you.

Well, after four years of waiting, I made it to an Innocence Mission Concert? I had missed them in concert four years earlier in Cleveland. This was the first time they had been back. After the show, Mike Bitts told me that in 1986 they were in Edinboro. I was there in college at the time, but did not know of them then! Here was the show in Lakewood OH on May 7th, 1995:

WE ARRIVED AT THE PHANTASY NIGHT CLUB AT 7:30 PM. THE PLACE WAS VERY DARK. THERE WERE ABOUT 30 PEOPLE THERE WHEN WE ARRIVED. BY NOW THERE WERE ABOUT 130 PEOPLE. THE CROWD WAS THERE TO LISTEN. IT WAS GREAT! PEOPLE WERE WEAVING AND BOBBING TO THE TUNES. MANY PEOPLE WERE SINGING ALONG. IT WAS DEFI-NITELY A ROOM OF FANS!

Anyway, I saw IM last night (May 15?) at the Birchmere, a 2-300 seat club in Alexandria, VA. My wife and I sat stage right immediately next to the stage. Nice place, good sound, pleasant atmosphere...a big improvement over the 9:30 Club where I'd seen the band before in DC. BTW, I don't have a setlist, for two reasons (a) it wasn't a Dead show, so I didn't come prepared (>), and (b) there was so much new stuff that the best I coulda done would have been to get about two-thirds of the songs.

Anyway, it was an excellent show. The audience was very enthusiastic, and the band seemed very pleased to be there. They kicked off with "Surreal", ended with "Wonder of Birds", and did two encores, and generally left everyone feeling very very happy with an intimate evening of music among friends...

Don has traded in his Stratocaster for what looked like a Gretsch hollowbody and, on a couple of songs, a beautiful blond Guild acoustic. Mike played a Guild acoustic bass all evening, and Karen mostly played guitar(!). And very well, I might add, though she kept dropping her pick. During "Both Sides Now" Don slipped her a new one in midsong and they pulled it off so neatly that Kim and I applauded; it earned us a quick look and grins from both of them.

Karen retains her charmingly shy stage personality. We were sitting right behind her electric piano (we were close enough to the stage that I kept getting my feet tangled in one of the monitor cables); when she walked over to play it for the first time she looked at us, said, "Hi," and giggled. What could we do? We said "Hi" right back. After the song she apologized for having her back turned to us.
